PETITION FOR CITIZENSHIP

To the Honorable the District Court of United States at Detroit, Mich.
The petition of Nikos Kankula, hereby and respectfully shown:
(1) My place of residence is 8362 Thaddaeus, Detroit, Mich. My occupation is Bid Setter.
(2) I was born in Hořeslavice, Czechoslovakia, on July 4, 1903. My name is Magnus.
(3) I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on Jan. 26, 1929 in the Circuit
Court of Wayne County, at Detroit, Mich.
(4) I am married. The name of my wife or husband is Margaret.

(6) I am not and shall never be in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the United States. It is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to

whom (which) at this time I am a subject (or citizen), and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States. (7) I am able to speak the English language. (8) I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since March 27, 1921, and in the County of Wayne.

this State, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since June 23, 1923, being a residence within said county of at least six months next preceding the date of this petition.

(9) I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship; Number (b) (6), on (b) (6), and such petition was denied by that Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit:

Attached hereto and made a part of this, my petition for citizenship, are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States, certificate from the Department of Labor of my said arrival, and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses required by law.
